### THE MISTAKE

Too often, stockrooms are designed as static, one-size-fits-all spaces. Fixed shelving, wide permanent aisles, or low stacking height leads to tons of wasted square footage, especially in stores with limited back-of-house real estate. You might be storing less product than you could, or overfilling bins and racks that are hard to access.

### **THE FIX**

You don't need a bigger stockroom, you need smarter storage space. Mobile shelving systems from Pipp allow you to remove fixed aisles and create high-density storage layouts that adjust to your inventory needs. By moving entire shelving units along guided tracks, you can increase storage capacity by up to 80% in the same footprint.

### **PRO STORAGE TIP:**

Incorporate accessories like dividers, baskets, and hangrails to further maximize how you use each inch of shelving.



### THE MISTAKE

When staff members can't easily find what they're looking for, it leads to errors, slowdowns, and frustrated team members. Disorganized stockrooms often result in overstocking, understocking, and duplicate ordering. Worse, products can become "lost" in your own space, sitting unsold until they're obsolete or expired.

### THE FIX

Visibility starts with logical organization. Group SKUs by category, season, or in-demand products, however your team most naturally accesses them. Best-selling products should live at eye level or in high-access zones.

Use clear signage, barcode labels, or digital inventory systems that let associates know exactly where to find and restock items.

Clear bin fronts, wire shelving, and pull-out drawers can also reduce visual clutter and help staff see exactly what's on hand at a glance.

workflows often lead to errors, damage to

THE MISTAKE

In many retail stores, associates have to walk in circles to pick products for restock or fulfillment. Long, unoptimized walking paths burn valuable time and contribute to team fatigue and disorganization. If your team is spending more time wandering your stockroom than serving customers, you've got a problem.

## THE MISTAKE THE FIX

Smart stockroom design reduces the physical burden on your staff. With mobile storage solutions, you eliminate the need to manually move products just to access a different aisle. Integrated features, like pull-out drawers, garment rods, and adjustable shelf heights, make picking and restocking easier and safer.

#### Automation doesn't always mean robotics

Sometimes, it's as simple as rethinking how storage units open and close, how carts move through your space, and how products are accessed at peak hours.

Ergonomics should be baked into your design from day one.

### THE FIX

Create intentional pick paths that follow the natural flow of your store's operations. Use high-density mobile shelving to place fast-moving items in accessible areas, and build your layout around common movement patterns, such as restocking from the back wall or picking along a route from receiving to sales floor.

Mobile carts, adjustable ladders, and collapsible totes can also support more efficient workflows, especially in high-volume or high-turnover environments like apparel or footwear retail.

**Think Lean:** The fewer steps an associate has to take to complete a task, the more time they have to focus on value-added activities.



### THE MISTAKE

Many retailers treat their stockroom like it's frozen in time. Static shelves, unchanging layouts, and no flexibility. But retail isn't static. Seasonal transitions, flash sales, and new product launches mean your storage needs can shift overnight.
